

Work Experience Opens Doors for Students with Disabilities

Goodwill Omaha's Work Experience program gives special-education students exposure to work situations in supportive, understanding environments. The program helps students take the first step toward making a smooth transition from high school to adulthood and the working world.

Goodwill Work Experience students gain exposure to real work environments and skills through a variety of assigned jobs at either a Goodwill Omaha location or one of our community partners' locations.

Students gain exposure to many work areas, including clerical, custodial, production and retail. In their job assignments, students perform the same duties that would be expected of permanent employees, under the guidance of an on-site supervisor and the direction of a trainer. Goodwill Work Experience trainers tailor each job to the specific abilities of the individual student and account for any special needs.





Benefits of the Goodwill Work Experience Program

Goodwill Omaha Work Experience students typically participate in the program daily throughout the school year, although days and times may vary. The program gives students opportunities that offer them many benefits:

- 1. Gain exposure to work skills through a variety of assigned jobs, including clerical, custodial, production and retail
- 2. Perform duties expected of permanent employees

- 3. Work under the guidance of an on-site Goodwill supervisor and the direction of a Goodwill Work Experience trainer
- 4. Perform duties adapted to each student's specific abilities and special needs
- 5. Work a schedule that permits students to attend their academic classes while allowing time for work activities
- 6. Receive a recommendation from Goodwill
- 7. Learn about community resources that can help students obtain the additional training or job that best suits them
- 8. Earn while you learn Work Experience students earn minimum wage while gaining valuable vocational training in the program

Work Experience Program Eligibility

To enroll in Goodwill Omaha's Work Experience program, students must have an identifiable, documented vocational or disadvantaging condition. Eligible students must be between the ages of 16 and 21, attending a high school in Goodwill Omaha's service area (Omaha, Blair, Bellevue, Fremont, Papillion, Gretna or Council Bluffs). Most Work Experience participants are referred to Goodwill Omaha by their school district's transition or special-education programs
